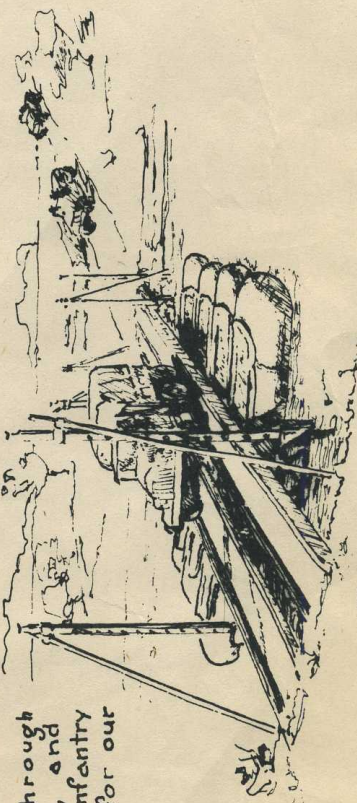


When the Group moved up to the Albert Canal above Maastricht it was found necessary to deploy as Infantry to chase Jerry out and across the Stream.
