


(2) The French laborers hired for the purpose of keeping mud off the MSR were not reemployed since it was found that they were making little progress. In an attempt to remove the mud more quickly, a drag was made using channel iron for the cutting blade, (see Incl #5). This drag proved to be better than other methods attempted, but it was not suitable for removing mud from hard surfaces. It was useful in the removal of the slush which formed on top of the mud packed on the MSR. Other methods attempted to remove the mud from the MSR and other roads were: (1) Use of a patrol grader. This method was abandoned, though more satisfactory than others, for fear of damaging the road surface and because of the excessive wear on the grader blade. (2) Use of a single "I" beam as a drag. This method did not prove satisfactory.

6 November 1944: In addition to the primary mission (1 November) secondary missions for the battalion were the same as for 5 November except for the following changes:

Company C - Completed access road for the 7th Army NP Center at Completed graveling motor park of the 11th Evacuation Hospital Romain. near Bayon.

Survey revealed: Over 1100 vehicles crossing the Manonviller bridge; over 1000 vehicles crossing the Marainville bridge; and over 200 vehicles crossing the Thiebaumenil bridge between the hours of 0900 and 1630.



Company "B" was located at Domfessel (Q 572393) and Company "C" was located at Button (Q 623414). The battalion had as a primary mission the repair and maintenance of the following roads: Route Null from Domfessel to Sarre-Union; Route Nol from Sarre-Union to Walsthol; Route N419 from Domfessel to RJ IC 13bly Route GC 27 from Lorentzen to Rahling. Route GC 109 from Rahling to CR IC 123; and Route IC 123 from CR to GC 109 to Diemeringen. Secondary missions were as follows:

- (2) Gravel pits and rock crushers operated by this battalion during the month produced the following amounts of material:

Crushed Rock - 1,142 yds Shale Rock - 2,494 " Cravel - 254 "

(3) The battalion water supply section dispensed 402,935 gallongs of water during the month.

When the period closed, the battalion was engaged in the maintenance of roads, security of obstacles, and operating rock crushers at Q 557285 and Q 566345.

### b. General Notes -

During the period covered by this report, the main axial and lateral roads assigned to the battalion for maintenance and repair were subjected to very large amounts of heavy traffic. Heavy rains and melting snow caused excessive surface and sub-surface satura-

tion of the ground. This saturation, coupled with the heavy traffic to which the roads were subjected, caused very rapid deterioration of the roads at many points.

From observation, it is felt that most of the failures were, for the most part, due to clogged drainage; and, when this was corrected, the deterioration was checked to a large extent. Once the failure had occurred, however, it was virtually impossible to effect any type of repair that would last any appreciable time, except by the following method: The area affected by the failure was out out to sufficient depth and width to insure that all of the saturated base and sub-base was removed. It was found that the average depth was from 16" to 20", the width and length being governed by the size of the area affected. The hole was then filled by laying a Telford type base of large, hand-placed, stone to with-in 6" of the normal road surface. Crushed stone, (12" to 3" average), was then placed and compacted. The resulting patch was of sufficient strength to carry the traffic load but was rough. This constituted the initial phase in the road repair, the second phase being as follows: After the initial compaction; (by traffic and heavy roller), the patch was scarified, worked level, and again rolled. Some fines (sand or crusher screenings) were added where additional binder was necessary just prior to, or, during the rolling. This resulted in a patch that was fairly smooth and at the same time strong and durable.

### Conclusions:

It is felt that, had the drainage been properly maintained prior to the heavy snows and later heavy rains, much of the damage could have been prevented or, at least, greatly minimized. A satisfactory repair can be accomplished only by the expenditure of much time, materials and labor. Dumping materials (rock, etc.) on top of failutes in the base and sub-base are a waste of time and materials.

After the above road failures had been repaired (near the end of the period), the battalien concentrated its efforts toward the repair of small "pot-holes" in the road surface. Patches consisting of tar and crushed rock, and crushed rock and sand (or other fines) were used. The former proved to be more satisfactory. The latter required daily maintenance until thoroughly compacted.

During the period of spring thaws and raim, the difficulty of draining chuck-holes in the MSH prior to patching was a problem of considerable magnitude. Upon the suggestion of the Group Commander, ejector pumps, operating on the Venturi principle, were developed. Experimentation produced the design show in Inclosure #5. One pump was provided for each air compressor. They preceded the patching crews and proved fairly effective.

Summary of Operations for the Period Ol0001A Hours March 1945 to 312400A Hours March 1945.

During the month, the Battalion was reli eved from attachment to the 1109th Engr (C) Group and was attached to the 100th Inf. Division for the purpose of supporting it during its advance on, and bey ond, Bitche. The Battalion was then detached from the 100th Inf. Di v. and again attached to the 1109th Engr (C) Group; and, under Group direction, supported the 3rd Infantry Di vision during its advance to, and beyond, the Rhine River.

Whi le working with the 100th Inf. Divisi on the Battali on CP remained in telephone contact with the CP of the Di vision Engineers, (325th Engr (C) En). Company Com manders were assigned sectors in accordance with assigned sectors of the companies of the Divi sion Engineers, and were instructed to work directly with the Company Commander of the Division Engineers in their sector and to give him the support he requested without requesting authority from Battali on H eadquarters. In addition, assi stance called for by the Divisi on Engineer was given promptly by taking personnel from the reserve company and from personnel who remained available within the other two companies.

While supporting the 3rd Inf. Di vision with the 1109th Engineer (C) Group, the Battali on was placed in direct support of the 540th Engineer (C) Broup, (2832 Engr (C) Bn), for the purpose of supporting the crossing of the Rhine River in the vicinity of Mannheim. To accomplish the mission, an advance CP was set up at the crossing site under one of the arches of the partially construct ed bri dge at this site. No request for Engineer work was made on the Battalion except for the maintenance of approach roads on the near-shore, until approximately H plus 10 hours, at which time a hurried request for the construction of near and far-shore ferry and DUWK landing sites was received.

Later, while still in direct support of the 500th Engr (C) Group, the Battalion was assigned the mission of maintaining the approaches to the

treadway bridge south of Worms, the ponton bridge at Worms, and the maintenance and securit y of the treadway bridge south of Worms. In addition, specific engineer duties that were assigned within the sector just forward of the Army forward boundary and west of the Rhine were to be taken care of by the Battalion. This work event ually required all personnel of the three line companies and a provisional platoon formed from the personnel of H&S Company. Though still assigned, the ferry and DUKW sites near Mannheim were considered of less importance and all personnel were removed from that area.

After being relieved of all engineer work and security west of the Rhine, the Battalion made a series of rapid moves that eventually brought it to the vicinity of Worth, on the Main River, with the mission of maintaining roads in t he area.

During the period 1 April 1945 to 30 April 1945 the Battalion was employed in numerous tasks including the construction of tactical and semi-permament bridges, the removal of obstacles and obstructions to the advance of the troops, the removal of mines, the destruction of German explosives, security of bridges, and the removal of tactical bridges.

A total of 861 feet of bridges was constructed by the Battalion during the period, as follows: 240 of DS Bailey Bridge, 120 feet of M-2 Treadway, 235 feet of Heavy Ponton and 266 feet of Semi-permament Construction.

During the period the Battalion was in support of the 1109 Engineer (C) Group and later in close support of the 42nd Infantry Division. Due to the fast moving situation and the ever increasing demand of Engineer work, the Battalion worked long and continuous hours to accomplish its mission.
