#### ENGINEER PLAN FOR ASSAULT RIVER CROSSING \*

I - MISSION

a. General - Support the assault river crossing of one division on a two ROT front by providing river crossing facilities.

b. Specific -

(1) Transport river crossing materials, equipment, and engineer personnel to the river.

(2) Operate storm and assault boats.

(3) Provide infantry support rafts, heavy ponton rafts, Dukw crossings (including necessary maneuver cables) for each RCT.

(4) Erect and maintain anti-mine barriers, anti-debris boom, and dummy bridge (including necessary maneuver cables).

(5) Provide a bridge company to assist the 85th Heavy Ponton Battalion in the construction of a divisional heavy ponton bridge.

(6) Provide continuous river patrol to protect means of crossing.

(7) Construct immediate approaches and exits for crossing sites.

(8) Upon army orders, after securing of the bridgehead, assume responsibility for road and bridge maintenance up to and including the floating bridge.

II - UNIT MISSIONS

a. Regimental Headquarters, 540th Engineer Regiment, Colonel George W. MARVIN, Commanding, will coordinate and supervise the operations of river crossing facilities for one division.

b. Regimental Headquarters and Service Company, 540th Engineer Regiment, will provide: personnel and equipment for the operation of Regimental Hq and CP, assist in transport of river-crossing equipment, assist in resupply, establish communications system.

c. First Battalion Hq. 540th Engineer Regt, Major J. C. O'BRIEN, Commanding, will coordinate and supervise the activities of engineer elements listed below, assisting the river cressing of one assault RCT.

1. Company "F", 540th Engineer Regt.

(a) Transportation of river-crossing personnel and equipment will be as specified in Annexes #2 and #3.

(b) Operate 48 storm boats (reinforced by 8 operators from the 85th Heavy Ponton Battalion) landing the first wave of two battalions of one RCT, guiding passangers from the final assembly areas to embarkation points. After discharging personnel on the far shore operators will return boats to near shore and beach or shuttle personnel as directed.

(c) Operate 42 double assault boats landing support companies of the assault battalions and attached troops of one RCT in Waves #2 to #7, drawing bowmen from Co "A" as directed.

(d) Establish a company collecting point on the near shore. Returning boat operators will report to collecting point upon completion of mission and be re-dispatched as directed.

(e) Operate assault boats as required for medical evacuation and smcke generation.

2. Company "B", 540th Engineer Regt.

(a) Transportation of river crossing personnel and equipment will be as specified in Annexes #2 and #3.

(b) Erect and maintain 2 maneuver cables for 1 Dukw crossing.

(c) Erect and maintain 2 infantry support raft maneuver cables.

(d) Erect and maintain 1 heavy ponton raft maneuver cable.

(e) Erect and maintain 3 anti-mine barrier maneuver cables.

(f) Erect and maintain 1 anti-debris boom maneuver cable.

(g) Erect and maintain 1 dummy bridge maneuver cable.

(h) Above cables listed in order of priority of construction. The two teams working under First Bn control will be assisted by team from Second Bn control for erection of (e), (f), and (g) above as this team becomes available.

3. Company "A", 540th Engineer Regt.

(a) Transportation of river crossing equipment and personnel as specified in Annexes #2 and #3.

(b) Construct and operate 2 five-boat infantry support fafts.

(c) Construct and operate 1 Class 40 heavy ponton raft.

(d) Construct and operate additional rafts as needed for replacement, or if construction of ponton bridge is delayed, calling upon battalion headquarters for additional operators if necessary.

(e) Keep accurate records of vahicles and equipment by organization crossing on rafts and render periodic reports to battalion headquarters (refer to Annex #7).

(f) Provide bowmen to Co "E" and Co "F" for double-assault boats as directed.

4. Company "C", 540th Engineer Regt.

(a) Transportation of river crossing personnel and equipment as specified in Annex #2 and Annex #3.

(b) Provide general engineering platoon to prepare approaches and exits for infantry support and heavy rafts, Dukw crossing, and floating bridge.

(c) Provide drivers for Co "F" organic vehicles as directed.

(d) Provide continuous river patrols to protect means of crossingc.

(e) Instal in river and maintain 3 anti-mine barriers (2 of which will be pre-fabricated by Co "B" and 1 by the 40th Engineer Regt.

(f) Instal and maintain 1 anti-debris boom.

d. Second Battalion Hq, 540th Engineer Regt, Lt Col S. A. KN/PP, Commanding, will coordinate and supervise the activities of engineer elements elements listed below, assisting the river crossing of one assault RCT.

1. Company "E", 540th Engineer Regt.

(a) Transportation of river-crossing personnal and equipment as specified in Annexes #2 and #3.

(b) Operate 48 storm boats (reinforced by 8 operators from the 85th Heavy Ponton Battalion) landing the first wave of two battalions of the assault RCT, guiding passengers from the final assembly areas to embarkation points. After discharging passengers of far shore, operators will return boats to the near shore and beach them, or shuttle additional waves as directed.

(c) Operate 42 double assault boats landing support companies of the assault battalions and attached troops of the one RCT in Waves #2 and #7, reinforced by bowmen from Co "A" as directed (see Annex #1 - Wave Diagram).

(d) Establish a company collecting point on the near shore. Returning boat operators will report to the collecting point upon completion of missions and be re-dispatched as directed.

(e) Operate assault boats as required for medical evacuation and smoke generation.

2. Company "B", 540th Engineer Regt.

(a) Transportation of personnel and equipment as specified in Annexes #2 and #3.

(b) Broot and maintain 2 moneuver cables for 1 Dake erossing.

(c) Brect and maintain 2 infantry support raft measurer college

(b) Construct and operate 2 five-boat infantry support rafts.

(c) Construct and operate 1 Class 40 heavy ponton raft.

(d) Construct and operate additional rafts as needed for replacement. ment, or if construction of ponton bridge is delayed, calling upon battalion Hq for additional if necessary.

(e) Keep accurate records of vehicles and equipment by organization crossing on rafts and render periodic reports to battalion Hq. (See Annex #7).

4. Company "C", 540th Engineer Regt.

(a) Transportation of river crossing personnel and equipment as specified in Annexes #2 and #3.

(b) Provide general engineering platoon to prepare approaches and exits for infantry support rafts, heavy ponton rafts, and Dukw crossing.

(c) Provide drivers for Co "E" organic vehicles as directed.

e. Company "D", 540th Engineer Regt, will assist the 85th Heavy Ponton Battalion in the construction of the divisional heavy ponton bridge and erection of the ponton bridge maneuver cables and maintain vehicle check (See innex #8).

f. The 424th Engineer Dump Truck Co will operate vehicles for the transportation of river crossing equipment and personnel to the river as directed and shuttle to haul dummy bridge as ordered.

g. Company "A", 84th Camouflage Battalion (- two platoons) will erect and maintain the divisional "dummy" bridge and such technical camouflage super-vision and inspection as requested. The company will provide an officer or NCO guide for 424th Dump Truck Co hauling dummy bridges.

h. Detachment, 85th Heavy Ponton Battalion will provide a total of 16 storm boat operators, eight to Company "E", 540th Engineer Regt, and 8 to Company "F", 540th Engineer Regt.

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Water points were set up and operated in Mirecourt, Roville and Gerbeviller supplying all troops in their respective vicinities. In addition



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a water point was set up in the grounds of the 21st General Hospital, Hirescurt to supply water solely for hospital use which included water for teilets, medical use, cooking, washing and bathing. During a seven (7) day period when operation of the water point in the hospital grounds ceased due to the flooding of the area an additional water point was set up in Mireccurt to alleviate the shortage. A total of 1.502.805 gallons of water was dispensed for the month.
