ACTIVITY JOURNAL SEPT/43

- Sept 1 - 10, 1943 - PALERMO, SICILY - TERMINI IMERESE, SICILY - Completed Officers' pay vouchers and Enlisted Men's payrolls for month of August, 1943 and paid approximately \$75,000.00 General inspection of Service Records and Officers' Qualification Cards made and incomplete data inserted.
- 1st Lt. Leo M. Tupper, O1101695, Company "B", 540th Engineer Regiment killed in action when 1/4 ton 4x4 truck in which he was a passenger ran over a mine. Pvt 1cl Louis P. Gentile, ASN 31104724, driver of the car from the same unit was injured. Incident occurred 1 September 1943. (See Casualty Annex #1)
- Sept 10- 15, - TERMINI IMERESE, SICILY - Personnel Section remained with Rear Echelon during initial stages of invasion of mainland of Italy. Inspection of Service Records continued and preparation was made for movement.
- Sept 15 - Regimental Rear Echelon, including Personnel Section landed at Gulf of Salerno, Italy (Blue Beach #1) and set up Personnel Section in basement of Regimental Headquarters, 13 km south of Salerno, (Gromola), Italy.
- Battle Casualty Report prepared listing 1 officer and 3 Enlisted Men wounded in action also report of 1 non-battle casualty prepared. (See Casualty Annex #1)
- Sept 15- 30 - 13 km. SOUTH OF SALERNO (GROMOLA), ITALY. Certified information obtained and battle action data entered on Service Records and Officers' Form 66-1. Work started on Enlisted Men's payroll and Officers' pay vouchers for month of September, 1943. Fifty (50) Enlisted Men dropped from rolls pursuant to provisions of Par 2b and 2c, Section I, NATOUSA Circular #65, cs, and records forwarded. Details of securing One hundred and one (101) EM replacements completed. All replacements reported and their records processed. Inaugurated "Present and Absent" Chart for controlling Strength and Present for Duty data for daily information.
