This past May 13 - 17 we held our 36th and last reunion. The decision to dissolve the organization was a difficult one, but the Executive Board, after months of discussion, was unanimous in their decision.

Because of health, age and financial problems of our members, attendance at the reunions have fallen off dramatically. It had also become very difficult to attract members to serve on our Board of Directors making it difficult to operate efficiently. Thankfully, Martin Kunofsky, Edward Kunofsky, Nicholas Penna, sons of veterans, have faithfully served on our board, but they have full time jobs and families, and that comes first.

It was also decided that any funds left over in our treasury be donated to the National Museum of the United States Army. Here, in the Veterans Hall, a Bronze plaque, with the name ANZIO BEACHHEAD VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II, will be placed, for all the world to see, for all time.

Because our fiscal year ends October 31, and until we have paid all of our bills, we will not be making any donation until later this year. It has been suggested, that instead of just mailing in a check, that we have a "Presentation Ceremony", a small reception with some of the Army dignitaries, We will look into this and send out notices for those wishing to attend. We estimate at this time we will have \$10,000 to donate.

It has been my pleasure to serve as President of this organization. It has given me the opportunity to know and meet the "greatest generation in the world".
